1ST SUNDAY OF LENT—RITE OF ELECTION

The Season of Lent begins this Wednesday, March 2nd. For us it is a time of repentance and renewal. For others among us it is a time also of the preparation for the sacraments to be celebrated at Easter.

On the first Sunday of Lent, the Church celebrates the Rite of Election, also known as the Enrollment of Names. With the Rite of Election, those who have been preparing to be Baptized, confirmed and celebrate the Eucharist, enter more deeply into their preparation for the Sacraments. This is a time of purification and enlightenment, which takes place during Lent.

The Rite celebrates the choice of those who wish to be admitted to the Easter Sacraments. The Bishop himself, as the Head of the local Church presides at the Rite of election. During the Rite, the Bishop declares the approval of the candidates after they are presented and examined by him.



OUR LENTEN SACRIFICE

The forty days of Lent run from Ash Wednesday up to but excluding the Mass of the Lord's Supper exclusive.

Abstinence: All Catholics who have reached their 14th birthday are bound to abstain totally from meat on the following days: Ash Wednesday, all Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.

Fasting: All Catholics between their 18th and 59th birthdays are also bound to observe the Law of Fast on the following days: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This practice involves limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between meals. Light sustenance may be taken on two other occasions in the course of the day.

Easter Duty: After they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, all the faithful are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year. This precept must be fulfilled during the Easter season, unless for good reason it is fulfilled at another time during the year. This obligation may be fulfilled between March 6, 2022 (First Sunday of Lent) and June 12, 2022 (Trinity Sunday).

NOW IS THE DAY OF SALVATION

This Wednesday begins the Season of Lent. Masses for Ash Wednesday will be at 8:00AM and 12:05PM. Ashes are blessed and imposed after the homily. You may remember that last year ashes were sprinkled on our heads due to Covid-19 Protocols. The Sprinkling of ashes on the head is a European custom of imposing ashes. This year we will return to the practice of placing ashes on the forehead unless the Vatican directs otherwise.
