

CATHOLIC CHARITIES NEEDS EXTRA HELP

The Catholic Charities Annual Appeal is continuing. Catholic Charities is in critical need of your help to meet its 2018 Appeal goal. With one month remaining, the Appeal is short \$1.2 million of its \$11 million goal. The Catholic Charities Appeal is at 89% of its goal with \$9,781,841.






