

UNITED STATES BANKRUPTCY COURT FOR THE WESTERN DISTRICT OF NEW YORK

United States Bankruptcy Court for the Western District of New York in re The Diocese of Buffalo, N.Y. Case No. 20-10322. Please take notice that, on February 28, 2020, The Diocese of Buffalo, N.Y., ("Diocese") filed for protection under chapter 11 of title 11 of the United States Code (the <u>Bankruptcy Code</u>"). The **Bankruptcy Court has established** August 14, 2021 at 11:59 p.m. (prevailing Eastern time) as the deadline to file proofs of claim against the Diocese (the "Bar Date"). If you have a claim against the Diocese, including, without limitation, a claim related to sexual abuse committed by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim on or before the Bar Date. Please visit https://case.stretto.com/dioceseofbuffalo or call 855-292-7696 for more information on how to file your proof of claim. If you do not timely file a proof of claim, you may forfeit your right to vote on any plan of reorganization and to share in any distributions to creditors in connection with the Diocese's Chapter 11 case.

THE CHALLENGE OF ATTENDING CHRISTMAS MASS

On Christmas Eve Masses will be at 2:30 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. On Christmas Day Masses will be at 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. There will be no midnight Mass.

The dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass remains in effect. Anyone who feels that their health will not allow them to attend Mass should not attend. Masses are being live streamed from many locations. This may be an option. We hope to have ours up and running by the time this bulletin is published.

In the orange zone our capacity is limited to 33%. This may sound like a lot but in reality it is not. To comply with social distancing regulations, our seating capacity is severely limited. Many pews are closed. There may be only one or two people in a pew. Only members of the same household may sit together in the same pew. No standing is permitted.

We will not be able to accommodate the crowds that we have had in the past. We will need to control the number of people in church. We pray that we will not have to turn anyone away.

FIRST RECONCILIATION & FIRST EUCHARIST CLASS REGISTRATION

Children receiving the sacrament of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist this spring at St. Louis must be registered to do so by January 19, 2021. To prepare for these sacraments, children will attend in-person sacrament preparation classes. Classes are scheduled for 3 consecutive Saturdays, February 6th, February 20th, and February 27th. All classes will be from 9:30—11:30 a.m. in the church hall. Attendance at all three classes mandatory.
