IS ALL SAINTS' DAY A HOLY DAY OF **OBLIGATION?**

Parishioners still ask, is All Saints' Day a Holy Day of Obligation? The answer is YES but only when November 1st falls on a Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday. The same applies to some other Holy Days of Obligation including January 1st, (Mary, Mother of God), The Assumption. Immaculate Conception is always a Holy Day of Obligation except in years when December 8th falls on a Sunday and the solemnity is observed on December 9th. Holy Days that do not follow this qualification are Ascension Thursday, which is always the Thursday of the sixth week of Easter. Christmas is always a Holy Day of Obligation no matter what days it falls upon.

"Responsible citizenship is a virtue, and political life is a moral obligation." (Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship.)
