

ST. LUCY FEAST DAY DECEMBER 13TH

A name that means "light", St. Lucy is the patron saint of those blind or suffering with eye trouble. Not much is known about her life, except that she was determined to remain a virgin and thus refused marriage. History tells the story of a frustrated suitor who eventually accused St. Lucy of being a Christian (a crime at the time) and she was executed in Syracuse, Sicily in the year 304.

Today, we celebrate a number of traditions that incorporate a symbolic meaning of St. Lucy as the "bearer" of light in the darkness of winter. This is particularly seen in Scandinavian countries, with long dark winters. There, a young girl dressed in a white dress and a red sash (as a symbol of martyrdom) carries palms and wears a crown or wreath of candles on her head. In Denmark, Norway and Sweden, girls dressed as St. Lucy carry rolls and cookies in procession as songs are sung.

Another tradition associated with St. Lucy is "St. Lucy's wheat" or winter wheat. It is prepared in traditional dishes to be eaten on St. Lucy's day. Another tradition is to plant the winter wheat in a cup and it will grow in time for Christmas Day when children bring their wheat to the manger.

ROAD TO RENEWAL

Over the past several months parishes have been meeting to discuss the *Family of Parishes* model that the diocese will be adopting in the very near future.

Last week The *Road to Renewal* announced the finalized *Families of Parishes*. There are a total of 36 parishes that are formed by the current 161 parishes in the diocese. These families of parishes will join together to share resources and staff under one pastor.

The process to form these families began over a year ago, the conversations in parishes helped determine the finalized families. Families range in size from three to six parishes. Six pilot families have been selected and will be activated January 17, 2022. The rest of the families will be established in phases; October 2022, October 2023, and October 2024.

The *Family* to which we belong consists now of 6 parishes, 6 worship sites and 1 school all within 2.4 miles. Originally, the downtown area was made up of 5 parishes, but through discussion and discernment 1 more parish has been added to our family of parishes. The parishes are: St. Louis, St. Joseph Cathedral, Blessed Sacrament, St. Anthony of Padua, and St. Michael. Our Lady of Perpetual Help has joined the family of parishes in downtown Buffalo.

Our family of parishes will begin in phase 2 which is October 2023. However, we have decided that this Advent would be a good time to come together as a family for an Advent Penance Service. The Penance Service will be held in two locations, one in the afternoon and one in the evening. It is scheduled for Monday, December 13th at 3:30PM at Blessed Sacrament Church on Delaware Avenue and at 6:30PM at St. Joseph Cathedral on Franklin St. All are welcome to attend either penance service.
