

The Church designated the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, Candlemas Day, as an appropriate moment to thank God for the gift of consecrated life. Jesus is manifest as "light of revelation for the Gentiles' and 'Glory for God's people Israel." Consecrated men and women reflect this light as witnesses of Jesus in a world that is often shrouded in shadow. They are the glory of God's people. We pray for consecrated men and women and ask God to continue enriching the Church with their unique vocation. Please pray for all those who have made commitments in the consecrated life, and be sure to thank them on their special day.

It is with pleasure that we congratulate, introduce and install our newly elected Parish Council members. We are grateful to the nominees for their willingness to serve and to the parishioners who nominated them. The Council received nominations of five well qualified candidates for five open seats.

Installation of all fifteen Parish Council members will take place this weekend at the Sunday 11:00 AM Mass. Again, we thank all of them for their added dedication to sustaining St. Louis as a wonderful and vibrant parish.

SAINT OF THE WEEK—FEBRUARY 8TH ST. JOSEPHINE BAKHITA

The story of Josephine Bakhita (1869-1947) is a story that many people taken into slavery have experienced. Born in the Darfur region of Sudan, she was kidnapped at the age of 8 and sold into slavery many times. As she passed from owner to owner, she experienced the moral and physical humiliations associated with slavery. It was at the age of 13 that her suffering was alleviated after she was bought for the Italian Consul in Sudan. It was here that she was fortunate to receive kindness, respect, and peace from her new master.

She was handed over to the Canossian Sisters where she made the case that slavery had been outlawed in Italy for many years. She was baptized and confirmed in the Catholic Church in 1890, where she took the name Josephine. She entered the Institute of St. Magdalene of Canossa in 1892 and made her profession three years later.

St. Joephine Bakhita's next 50 years were spent serving people through cooking, sewing, embroidery, and housekeeping. She was a source of encouragement and her constant smile won people's hearts, as did her humility and simplicity. She dedicated her life to sharing her testament of deliverance from slavery and comforting the poor and suffering.

She was declared a saint in 2000. The day of prayer on February 8th is intended to raise awareness of and encourage reflection on the violence and injustice that impact victims of human trafficking.

FIRST RECONCILIATION & FIRST EUCHARIST SPRING 2022

St. Louis will be offering the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist this spring. All children making a sacrament this spring must attend sacrament preparation classes on Saturday, March 5th, March 12th, & March 19th from 9:30-11:30 AM in the church basement. The First Reconciliation ceremony will be on Saturday, April 30th and the First Eucharist ceremony will be on Sunday, May 1st.

First Reconciliation classes are open to children who are in second grade. First Eucharist classes are open to children who are in third grade. All children should be actively participating in faith formation classes, either at St. Louis or their school. Parents must register by February 13th.
