#### ROAD TO RENEWAL IS UNDERWAY

The Diocese has begun the Road to Renewal beginning with the pilot parishes of Family of Parishes. St. Louis will join with Blessed Sacrament, St. Michael, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Joseph Cathedral, and Our Lady of Perpetual Help in the family of parishes during phase two of the renewal.

In order to help us prepare, we will be participating in a parish-wide survey about discipleship conducted by the Catholic Leadership Institute. The survey will take about 10 to 15 minutes to complete and will be open to everyone in the parish. We will be asked to reflect on our own spiritual growth and to provide feedback on our parish's efforts to help us grow as disciples of Christ. All responses will be confidential and the parish will only receive information about the community as a whole.

The information will be made available to the parish and our various ministries as we plan the future. We will receive the results of the survey this spring or summer.

The survey will be available online. It can be completed online or a printable version of the survey will also be available. For those who prefer, paper copies will also be available. The survey will be available March 2nd through April 4th. When more information is available, it will be shared with you and directions will be given for taking the survey.

#### SAINT OF THE WEEK—ST. VALENTINE

On Monday, February 14th, we celebrate Valentine's Day. It is also the feast of Saints Cyril and Methodius, brothers who were important in evangelizing the Slavic people.

Although not much is known about St. Valentine, he is forever remembered by the church and secular society. There are at least three different St. Valentines, all of them martyrs, mentioned in early martyrologies under the date of February 14th. One is described as a priest at Rome, another as bishop of Interamna (present Terni), and both of them were probably martyred around the year 269. Both were buried on the Via Flamina at different distances from the city of Rome. Of these St. valentines, there are some writings preserved of questionable historic value because they are relatively late writings not from the time in which they lived. The only thing known about the third St. Valentine is that he and a number of companions suffered in Africa.

The custom of sending Valentines arose from a number of legends surrounding the lives of the St. Valentines. One legend has it that the night before he died, St. Valentine scrawled a message on a heart shaped stone writing: "to those who love me, and to those I love, know that my heart is with you to the end." He signed the message "Your Valentine". The St. valentine described as a priest at Rome was also believed to be a physician and legend has it that he sent letters of love and encouragement to the people of his community who lived in fear of persecution.

Another explanation for the custom of sending Valentines comes from the Middle Ages. People believed that on February 14th, the day St. Valentine died, birds began choosing their mates for springtime. For this reason the day was looked upon as specially consecrated to lovers and as a proper occasion for writing love letters and sending lovers tokens. So this day came to be thought of as a the perfect day to chose a sweetheart. No matter how the occasion came to be, the important lesson is that we never forget to convey our love for one another.
