

UPON THIS ROCK UPDATE

From January 2016 until June 2016 St. Louis Parish was part of the *Upon This Rock* initiative. As part of this program, parishes were asked to identify a need that they would like to address in order that each parish may continue their good works. Because of your generosity to the Upon This Rock Campaign, we have been able to complete several major projects.

We should now have reached the end of our two yearly disbursements from the Upon This Rock campaign. There may still be some residual funds disbursed to St. Louis as final pledges are received by the *Upon This Rock* campaign.

At the end of January the parish received \$2806.83. This added to our previous disbursements totals \$364,825.41. Thank you for remaining faithful to your pledge commitment to Upon This Rock.

WE CELEBRATE TWO GREAT SAINTS THIS WEEK

This coming week we honor two of the most famous saints of the Church. On March 17th we celebrate the Feast of St. Patrick who is revered by the Irish and those of Irish descent. He is honored and remembered for bringing the Catholic Faith to the country of Ireland. We honor the memory of St. Patrick with the wearing of the green, St. Patrick's Day Parades, meals of corned beef and cabbage and probably a little more Guinness than we should. Today, St. Patrick's Day is celebrated by people of all backgrounds and remains an important reminder of the gift of our faith that we should not be afraid to show off.

St. Joseph is honored March 19th and is revered by many people. He is remembered for being the husband of Mary and the foster father of Jesus. He was a carpenter, a working man. He wasn't rich. He was a compassionate and caring man. He too was a man of faith, obedient to what God asked of him. He is probably the most well-known at this time of year because of the numerous feasts prepared in his honor called the St. Joseph Table. Begun, by the Sicilians, the St. Joseph Table is now celebrated by people of all backgrounds. Those who partake of a St. Joseph Table do so not only enjoy a wonderful meal, but also to be able to contribute to the less fortunate in our community. The St. Joseph Table is usually a meatless meal because it occurs during Lent. The meal is to be shared with those who are poor. It has become customary to have a St. Joseph Table and the proceeds given to Charity.
