The Pastors of our Family of Parishes met on December 12, 2022 and determined the timeline for forming our Family. The activation of our Family will take place on February 15, 2023. The process to complete this activation will take six months.

In the next few months there will be simple "meet and greet" gatherings for parish staffs, parish councils, and finance councils so that we may introduce ourselves to one another. After these initial meetings, committees will be formed with members of each parish to discuss the larger issues in activating the Parish Family. When the time comes, anyone interested should contact the parish office.

On August 15, 2023, the downtown Family of Parishes will come into existence.



FIRST RECONCILIATION & EUCHARIST SPRING 2023

St. Louis will be offering the sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist this spring. All children making a sacrament this spring must attend sacrament preparation classes on Saturday March 11th, Saturday March 18th and Saturday March 25th from 9:30-11:30AM in the Church Hall. The First Reconciliation ceremony will be on Saturday, May 6th and the First Eucharist ceremony will be on Sunday, May 7th.

First Reconciliation classes are open to all children who are in second grade. First Eucharist classes are open to children who are in third grade. All children should be actively participating in Faith Formation classes, either at St. Luis or their school. **Parents must register by February 11th**.
