

Recognizing the spiritual and cultural significance of St. Patrick's Day, Bishop Fisher is granting a commutation of the discipline of abstaining from meat on March 17th, 2023.

A commutation of this discipline means that those Catholics who choose to eat meat on Friday, March 17th are obliged to choose another day before March 24th, 2023 to abstain from eating meat.




