

WHAT CAN WE DO AS A FAMILY TO OBSERVE LENT?

Prayer:

- 1. Read and meditate on some Scripture each day.
- 2. Attend Mass more often than each Sunday.
- 3. Pray family morning, night, and meal prayers
- 4. Attend Stations of the Cross on Fridays (or make them as a family or alone if your parish does not offer them).
- 5. Make a pilgrimage.
- 6. Learn to pray the Divine Office, the official daily prayer of the whole Church.

Fasting:

- 1. Give up smoking, sweets, coffee, or something else you like.
- 2. Fast (one full meal per day only on one or more days of the week, health permitting.
- 3. Turn the TV off to make time for prayer or family time.

Almsgiving:

- 1. Give of your time to your family, an elderly neighbor, or a relative in need.
- 2. Eat more simply and donate the savings to the hungry.
- 3. Make a financial contribution to a charitable organization.

Repentance:

Another important theme which comes to light in this quotation is the need for repentance. A thorough, good confession is a traditional and praiseworthy way to prepare for Easter.
