# **ST. LOUIS CONTINUES TO BENEFIT FROM UPON THIS ROCK**

The Upon This Rock Campaign is in its final stages and has reached almost \$108 million. This total as of January 31, 2018 is 108% of the goal. The goal of this endeavor is to raise \$100 million to support the various ministries that are so necessary for the functioning of the diocese. A portion of this campaign is also meant to support individual parishes in the diocese to continue their unique and various ministries as well.

The next chapter of the campaign is now unfolding, Upon This Rock continues to send disbursement checks to parishes. The Foundation for the Roman Catholic Diocese of Buffalo, the organization that manages the generously donated funds, disburses funds every six months, on January 31 and July 31. Any parish that has completed its campaign receives a check with a portion of its parish share. We are one of those parishes that received a portion of the funds we raised for Upon This Rock

On January 31, 2018 St. Louis received its third portion of the Upon This Rock proceeds. We received \$23,110.25 to further our efforts at St. Louis. The total we have received in the year of 2017 was \$87,786.91. To date St. Louis has received from Upon This Rock \$110,924.16. Over the course of the next few years we will receive two disbursements to be used for a lift and modifications to the church hall.

Thank you once again for your most kind generosity in supporting the works of St. Louis Parish.

# CAMERATA ORCHESTRA, ST. LOUIS CHOIR JOIN FORCES IN MARCH 4TH CONCERT

The Choir of St. Louis Church, Frank Scinta director, will join the Camerata di Sant' Antonio Chamber Orchestra under the direction of Christopher Weber in *Music from Aloft* on <u>Sunday, March 4th</u> at <u>7:00 p.m.</u> in St. Louis Church, Main and Edward Streets in downtown Buffalo. Joining them will be soloists from the Harmonia Chamber Singers. Admission is \$18.00 and proceeds will benefit the orchestra's performance fund.

*Music from Aloft* will feature the area premiere four new works by Maarten Sprujit, Robert Ingals, George Pelecis, and Allan Stephenson. Rounding out the program will be Remo Giazotto's arrangement of Albinoni's *Adagio for Strings*. The first half of the program will be performed from the choir loft of St. Louis, followed by a reception and additional works in the church's historic sanctuary.

The Camerata di Sant' Antonio Chamber Orchestra remains one of Western New York's preeminent professional chamber groups. Hailed for its extensive repertoire inventive programming, the Camerata perform throughout the year both alone and in collaboration with many of the region's finest vocal and instrumental music organizations.

The Choir of St. Louis Church is an all-volunteer ensemble composed of members of the parish. Its members rehearse each Thursday evening and lead the musical worship at 11:00 a.m. each Sunday. Its repertoire covers nine centuries of sacred music and nearly every style of western composition. In past years, members of the choir have performed with the Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra, Ars Nova Musicians, Greater Buffalo Opera Company, Opera Sacra, Camerata di Sant' Antonio and the Dave Brubeck Quartet.
