# THERE IS LIGHT IN THE DARKNESS

Once again, these days, the media has been filled with the pain and suffering the Church in Buffalo has been experiencing due to past and present sins of some of our priests. It is not the first time the Church has faced struggles and difficulties and unfortunately it probably will not be the last.

St. Paul in his second letter to the Thessalonians also addressed the struggles of the early Church. Not only were the Thessalonians suffering from persecution, but also there were false prophecies and rumors swirling about purportedly written by St. Paul. The community was unsettled much like our Church is today.

Even though the Thessalonians were facing all kinds of problems, St. Paul chose to begin his letter to them commending them for their ever-increasing faith. St. Paul saw more than the problems. He saw all the good that was happening among them. His encouragement helped them to see that good for themselves.


Sometimes in the face of obstacles we all need a kind word to keep us moving forward in order that we might not lose sight of all the good the Church still does. A simple word of encouragement can change the tone of an environment and bring peace to a situation on the verge of discord. Even a humble "thank you" can brighten someone's day.

Just as St. Paul chose to recognize the growing faith of the Thessalonians, so too we can choose to see the good in people and let them know about it. In these dark days it is easy to lose sight of the more powerful good that the Church is doing because we are surrounded by such dark clouds. Let us not give up hope and remember that we are part of a wider mission that needs attention at this time too.

We continue to pray for the victims of abuse of any kind. We continue to pray for healing and a just resolution to all for all who have suffered because of such sin.

# FAITH MOMENT REFLECTION

In Mark's Gospel today Jesus challenges the authorities who had criticized the actions of His disciples. The Pharisees were caught up in following rituals to the tiniest detail and they passed judgment on the disciples for not following their ways. Jesus rebukes them as hypocrites saying, "you disregard God's commandments, but you cling to human traditions." Jesus stresses that the customs and rituals we practice are not what really makes us good and just. Rather, it's what's in our hearts—our reasons for doing what we do—that define whether our actions are in keeping with God's plan for us. Sure, we can talk the talk. But are we walking the walk? Take some time to revisit your motives and let what is within your heart guide you in how you express your faith.

# PASS ON THE GOOD NEWS!

Help pass on the Good News of Jesus Christ and our Catholic faith!. This fall, children and adolescents, preschool through grade 10, will sign up to learn more about Jesus and the Catholic faith. You can help by becoming a catechist for Faith Formation. Catechists teach 1 to 3 hours each month from late September through April. Classes are multi-age (PreK-K, 1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 7-8, & 9-10) and are typically small, between 8-10 students. St. Louis provides all classroom and educational resources.

### RCIA REGISTRATION

Are you considering becoming Catholic? Do you know someone who is being called to join our faith? RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is the process through which adults are received into the Catholic Church. The process is intended for adults: (1) who were never baptized; (2) those baptized in another Christian faith who wish to become Catholic; and (3) those baptized Catholic, but did not make their First Holy Communion or were not Confirmed.

Classes are held on Sundays, directly after the 11:00 Mass (approximately 12:00 to 1:00 p.m.), in the St. Louis Sacristy. RCIA will begin Sunday, September 16th and continue through March. Confessions will be heard after services on weekdays, but not on Sundays or the feast day. There will be no afternoon Benediction services on either Sunday during the Novena.
