WE CELEBRATE TWO **GREAT SAINTS THIS WEEK**

This coming week we honor two of the most famous and beloved saints of the Church. March 17th we celebrate the Feast of St. Patrick who is revered by the Irish and those of Irish decent. He is honored and remembered for bringing the Catholic faith to the country of Ireland. We honor the memory of St. Patrick with the wearing of the green, St. Patrick's Day Parade, meals of corn beef and cabbage and probably a little more Guinness than we should. Today, St. Patrick's day is celebrated by people of all backgrounds and remains an important reminder of the gift of our faith that we should not be afraid to show off.

St. Joseph is honored on March 19th and is revered by many people. He is remembered for being the husband of Mary and the foster father of Jesus. He was a carpenter, a working man. He wasn't rich. FAITH MOMENT REFLECTION

The scripture readings from today teach us that fidelity to God's Word is at the very core of our Christian faith. Throughout the scriptures we discover that faith does not mean blindly believing in things or events. Rather, faith is shown to be a profound trust placed in a person. Our loyalty to our faith simply means having a profound trust in God. We have faith that what God tells us-through the scriptures and through his church-is the truth. We have faith that his will for us is in our best interest. And we have faith that his promises will be fulfilled. In other words, we take God at his word. Like Abraham in this week's first reading, we are called to embrace God's word, his guidance and his promises. In turn, he will lead us to peace and happiness, and ultimately, eternal life. This Lenten season is a good time to focus on God's Word and how it guides our lives. It is in deepening our relationship with God that we deepen our trust in him; and from that our obedience to his will flows naturally.
