FAITH MOMENT REFLECTION

Today's scripture tells us of Paul and Barnabas traveling from city to city preaching the Gospel and "opening the door of faith" for new disciples. Paul and Barnabas encouraged their new disciples to build their faith, telling them that, although they may face hardships along the way, God would be with them. They would persevere. What this tells us is that entering a faith community marks only the beginning of our faith journey. Being true to our faith and our beliefs through words and actions is not always easy.
