

This Tuesday, August 25th, is the Feast of St. Louis for whom our Church and Parish are named. Along with the Feast of St. Louis, we also begin our Annual Preservation Fund Drive. To say the least we have been experiencing some very trying times that have come along with the Covid-19 Pandemic. In the midst of all of this, through your generosity, we have been able to maintain our parish operations and pay our bills. We surpassed our goal by over \$6,000 for a total of \$116,227.92.


